

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

## THE LOCATION

Patagonia is a wild land and the Rio Pico region remains as it has been for many years.

After landing at the Esquel Airport and being met by a Las Pampas Lodge representative, guests begin the 2.5-hour drive south from the airport to the lodge, probably thinking they're getting a feeling for what the final destination's landscape will be like. Not so.

In the first hour, the road passes through arid lands reminiscent of Utah. An hour later things look more like eastern Montana before the region hints of Yellowstone and Montana's Paradise Valley. **By the time anglers reach the lodge, it becomes clear that this is a place unto itself — both familiar and totally unique at the same time.**

Ultimately, guests are tucked up against the base of the snowcapped Andes, in a fantastical landscape with endless diversity and intrigue. Things change slowly in this corridor of the Andes.

Located in the Chubut Province of Central Patagonia, the lodge is in the "heart" of the Rio Pico area. Well beyond the lush bustle of Bariloche and Esquel (home of several lodges and many anglers) to the north, but shy

of the harsh, almost uninhabited steppe typical of the Santa Cruz Province to the south, the region of Chubut is a diverse mix of everything one could want. The lodge is located beyond the well-travelled roads and just outside the tiny border town of Aldea Las Pampas. **We're surrounded by countless rivers, streams, and lakes and enjoy these waters without pressure from other anglers.**

This region is called Rio Pico and took its name from Octavio Pico, who helped engineer the border lines between Chile and Argentina in 1881. It's appropriate that this unique region was named after him and equally appropriate that he was Argentine: drawing the border to deviate from the Pacific/Atlantic divide model and designating the upper 25 miles of the glorious spring-fed, west-flowing Rio Pico as Argentine.

It's a remarkable region nestled east of the Andes' highest peaks, where fertile lake systems and multiple spring creeks coalesce into an intimate and iconic South American trout stream, which ultimately slips west across the border into Chile and on to the Pacific.

## THE LODGE



### *At Las Pampas Lodge, we know that there's more to a fishing trip than just the fishing.*

Las Pampas Lodge is a beautiful European-style log and stone structure featuring a main common area with a guest lounge, dining room, and bar that is flanked by four spacious double occupancy guest rooms, all with private baths.

Each guest room opens onto a cobblestone veranda overlooking the surrounding Andes mountainous landscape. The inviting main room has a central fireplace surrounded by a semicircle of plush built-in lounge chairs where guests can gather each evening for cocktails and share their daily adventures.

Upstairs, guests enjoy a living room with comfortable couches and a flat screen TV, a private office with a computer and phone, and a fully-equipped fly tying table. The lodge has every amenity you'd expect from a classic trout lodge without being over-the-top.

The cuisine at Las Pampas Lodge is best described as gourmet farm-to-table fare. Our head chef, a graduate of Le Cordon Bleu, is passionate about the food he prepares and uses only the freshest local and organic ingredients. Many of the vegetables are grown by the community in the nearby town and sold to raise funds for the local school. Eduardo, the lodge's full-time caretaker and cameo breakfast cook, collects fresh eggs daily and prepares fresh cuts of chicken, lamb, and beef from the free-range livestock that roam the property.

Breakfast is a standard yet filling meal featuring made-to-order eggs, toast, bacon, fruit, coffee, tea, and juice.

Lunch is served streamside by our guides and commonly includes homemade gourmet dishes, salads, beverages, and desserts.

Dinner is served late evening in traditional Argentine fashion, and the typical menu is comprised of inspired choices that range from fresh lamb and vegetarian dishes to thick-cut steaks and chops — all of which are paired with local Argentine wines.

All in all, Las Pampas Lodge is a truly remarkable place. From its location way out at the end of the

road, to its spectacular mountainous backdrop, to the depth and diversity of its fishing program, few places can claim all that it offers.

Add to that a dedicated, friendly, and local staff, and it comes as no surprise that Las Pampas Lodge captures the true essence of Patagonia.





## THE GUIDES



Las Pampas Lodge's enthusiastic and passionate guides are the best in the area, and for good reason: they are locals who speak fluent English, and they spend the entire 180-day season fishing the Rio Pico region. With that many days on the water, these guys know where and when to find the best fishing.

Our guides are dry fly junkies. They push beyond the boundaries of what most dry fly enthusiasts would consider optimal topwater conditions. They challenge their anglers to stick to their guns and use dries at times when most North Americans would back down and switch to subsurface techniques. Best of all, they make it work.

Despite their strong tendencies to focus on headhunting for rising fish, when conditions dictate, they happily switch into their signature "we do what we gotta do" mode and approach the water with dry/dropper, nymph, or streamer rigs to get their clients into fish.

One of the most unique elements of the Las Pampas fishing experience is that every pair of anglers is assigned a guide and assistant guide each day. At first this might seem like overkill, but once the truck pulls up to the first of many gates en route to the fishing grounds it becomes very apparent how much this subtle difference enhances the experience of every angler. Outside of being the official gate-opener and closer, the assistant guide is constantly busy in the background and takes care of the initial setup of client rods, prepares rafts, runs shuttles, and prepares lunch so the main guide can focus on our guests and creating the best possible experience on the water.


Another unique feature and highlight about Las Pampas Lodge is that the guides provide, for no extra cost, all terminal tackle, including leaders, tippets, and flies. No more filling your boxes with often-unneeded fly patterns or worrying about how old your tippet is. Las Pampas has you covered. In Oggy's words, "This way we know every angler has the right stuff for every fishing situation we put them in."



## THE FISHING



### WHEN IT COMES TO AVAILABLE WATER TYPES, FISHING STYLES AND TROUT SPECIES, LAS PAMPAS LODGE MAY BE UNBEATABLE.

With a multitude of spring creeks, small to medium-size freestone rivers, and trophy stillwaters, as well as a mix of rainbow, brown, and brook trout all within a relatively small radius, anglers are presented with far more options than they could experience in a two or even three-week stay.

This provides our guests the opportunity to sample multiple different types of water during their stay or

concentrate solely on those they most prefer. Generally speaking, the majority of fish caught are rainbows and the larger fish are brown trout.

Typically, anglers and guides leave the lodge in the morning in fully-equipped 4x4 trucks loaded with inflatable NRS rafts with specially-designed fishing frames. The majority of the drive is spent on rough back roads that are interesting and adventuresome in their own right, before coming back to the lodge late in the afternoons after spending the day on the water.

This well-choreographed fishing program delivers a level of customer service and genuine adventure that puts Las Pampas in a class by itself.

## THE RIVERS

The Rio Pico begins as a small willow-lined spring creek and grows quickly as additional spring creeks and small freestone rivers add to its volume. As the river flows westward, it breaks into multiple channels that flow swiftly through open pasturelands. Below the channels the Pico is joined by two medium-size freestones — first by the Rio Pampas and further downstream by the Rio Nilson. The next 10 miles of the Pico offer abundant and sometimes large rainbows and fewer but larger browns that can surpass the 27-inch mark. Although these sections of the river are public, they are very hard to access, requiring two things that Las Pampas has: permission from

local landowners to drive to the river on their property and keys to locked gates.

All in all, the Pico offers more than 25 miles of water, five distinct floatable sections, and endless wade fishing opportunities before crossing into Chile on its way west through the Andes. Upper, middle, and low reaches are accessed very easily from Las Pampas Lodge.

In addition to the much-touted Rio Pico, we fish other systems, such as the Rio Pampas and the Rio Nilson. These are medium-sized freestone rivers where anglers typically see steady action sight casting to rainbows and browns in the 10- to 20-inch class.

Both streams offer miles of fantastic walk and wade opportunities.


Included in Las Pampas' never ending nearby offerings is the mighty Rio Corcovado — a large freestone river with gin clear water pouring out of the huge Lake Vinter. "The Corco" — as locals call it — holds the healthiest trophy brook trout run in the world and also provides anglers the possibility of catching the biggest rainbow trout in all Argentina rivers. These hogs sit behind the spawning trophy brookies and feed on minnows and eggs. Every angler should fish this unique run at least once in his or her lifetime.



## SPRING CREEKS

The Rio Pico watershed is home to over a dozen fantastic spring creeks, all of which ultimately feed into the Pico. Varying greatly in size, length, depth, and current speed, each creek presents its own set of angling challenges.

For lovers of small and at times technical waters, these often overlooked gems have a great deal to offer. Most of these intimate spring creeks hold surprising numbers of good-sized rainbows and trophy browns that are all too willing to rise to a well-presented dry fly. They are one of the secret gems of Las Pampas Lodge.



## STILL WATERS


Despite the wide array of river and stream fishing options, the Rio Pico area is best known to locals for a series of five highly productive lakes scattered throughout the region's rugged hills. Though each lake has its own nuances, they all share similar shorelines dominated by rocky outcroppings, thick vegetation, and monster trophy fish feeding on any

"unidentified flying objects" that hits the water near them.

Typically, the Las Pampas guides will row their anglers just off the shorelines enabling their guests to both blind cast and sight cast large dry flies towards the banks. While many northern hemisphere anglers immediately dismiss the thought of lake fishing, we feel it remiss to visit this region without giving it a go.

Not only do these lakes produce the region's largest fish, but they also can provide very exciting fishing complete with crushing topwater takes and memorable sight fishing opportunities.

Casting a big foam fly from a raft to a rising fish with the potential of having a 20- to 28- inch brown or rainbow come up and suck it in brings a whole new experience of lake fishing.





## LAS PAMPAS Experience



Have you ever dreamed of getting in the books for catching a world record trophy fish? This is your opportunity!


During special periods of the fishing season, some very specific waters in the Las Pampas lineup mature and offer visiting anglers a unique chance to target some of the world's largest brook trout. During the majority of the season these monster brookies inhabit a number of key lakes where they are hard to catch, but in the austral summer and fall they migrate up a number of key rivers where they become easier to target. These systems are hard to reach. To be able to discover and enjoy

these water systems, we consider it necessary to camp in those remote areas to avoid long daily transfers.

Trips are a combination of Las Pampas Lodge and camping nights. Guests will enjoy a culinary experience like never before thanks to the flavor that wood smoke gives to all our cuts of meat and vegetables, along with cocktails by the fire under a million stars.

**For anglers serious about big brook trout, we recommend booking this special extension trip onto a standard lodge stay.**

## LP Esquel Waters *(Add On)*

When flying all the way down to Central Patagonia, why not extend your stay and get to fish different waters of our region? A great add-on to the Las Pampas Lodge Program involves fishing the rivers of Esquel, Trevelin, and Los Alerces National Park.

Our guides know the region very well and have access to prime private waters. We're also licensed to fish in Los Alerces National Park. We recommend this add-on for couples and anglers who prefer to fish mainly out of a raft or motorboat.

Anglers will have the chance to fish a complete water system, starting from a tiny spring creek on the Argentine side of the Andes, all the way down to the Pacific Ocean in Chile. With PatagoniaOne, anglers can enjoy spotting feeding trout in small streams, floating huge rapids, fishing for lake trophies, intimate and high-end lodging, five-star camping, the best wines of both countries, valleys, glaciers, canyons, and countless wild fish.

This borderless program will maximize the opportunities for our guests to experience Patagonia on the deepest level possible.

# URBAN DORADO ANGLERS

## Buenos Aires - Rio Parana Delta

If you're a passionate fly fisher, you've spent your share of layovers in Buenos Aires waiting for the next day's flight to the famed waters of Patagonia. You've done the sights - the tango shows, the steak restaurants, Evita's grave.

Now it's time to try something new: Take a 30-minute transfer to where city lights yield to the unexpected Paraná Delta, an 8,400-square-mile labyrinth of islands, waterways, and flowering trees. Here, Urban Dorado Anglers (UDA) guides will be waiting for you at the marina with all the gear you need to enjoy a great day on the water.

Freshwater dorado are an obsession for many fly fishers. Dorado are aggressive, golden, and explosive. Our guides are local, English speaking, and arguably the best dorado guides in the Buenos Aires region.

A few hours after arriving in Buenos Aires, you can toss big streamers from the deck of a UDA skiff boat with skyscrapers in view, then round a bend and stalk fish with not a human in sight.

High-end fly fishing gear is included, as well as exceptional

meals and all drinks. The package delivers a remarkable approach to nature, far from what anyone would expect so close to the cultural epicenter of Buenos Aires.

**LOCATION:** The Paraná Delta is formed by a group of islands and rivers, which originated from the two largest rivers in the region, the Rio Paraná and Rio Uruguay. These are great waters for dorado fishing and other fantastic freshwater species.

This is a unique place in the world, where people live in elevated wooden houses. It's a different reality, but very close to Buenos Aires City. The whole Delta is a complex water system, which is affected by the winds, the rains in the north of the region, and the ever-changing tides. This is why the experience and knowledge of our guides are fundamental for a successful day.

One of our fishing areas is located around the Martín García Island (among other secret streams and tributaries). This famous island is an historic place that was discovered by the Spanish in the 16th century and was regarded as prized land due to its location within the watershed.



**FISHING PROGRAM:** Depending on conditions, we operate within nearby island chains that are scattered throughout the Paraná Delta and Rio de la Plata (the widest river in the world). We also guide at nearby estancias, with exclusive UDA private access to the best sections of the lower Paraná River and its tributaries.

Fish habitats include small channels in between islands, shores along the main and lower branches of the Paraná, tributary wading rivers, lagoons, and the exterior border of the Delta where it meets the Rio de la Plata.

Your UDA Day Trip will begin after breakfast or upon landing in Buenos Aires with a prearranged transfer to the marina (30 minutes) or to one of our private estancias (1 hour), depending on weather conditions.

After a morning fishing session, and depending on where the fishing takes place, the lunch break will either be on a sand beach, onboard our skiffs, or on a shoreline under the shade of a thick jungle forest. All drinks, alcoholic and non-alcoholic, are included in our gourmet lunch.

The afternoon fishing session ends when the sunset hits the skyline of the city. But don't worry - you won't be late for dinner - everyone is aware of late dining customs in Argentina.

Scheduled transfers return guests to their hotel or the international/ domestic airport to fly to their next destination.

### SPECIES

**Dorado:** Although the colorful species and its aggressive behavior make it one of the most exciting gamefish to catch, there is very little documented about fly fishing for dorado in this area. Its complex feeding regime and migratory nature ensure challenging and rewarding fishing opportunities for both expert and entry-level anglers. Dorado are strong and acrobatic, and their pursuit is often more about quality experiences than a numbers game. Our dorado range from 2 to 6 pounds, but guests continue to land 8 to 10+ pounders.

**Tararira:** also known as wolfish, are another awesome species that we target. These prehistoric-looking, aggressive fish take poppers and surface flies like few others. Sight fishing for them is our specialty. They are similar in size to local dorado with our largest (so far) clocking in at 11 pounds.

- Fly fishing gear / YETI coolers / UDA hats and stickers
